Lewis Scott



Lewis Scott is a young organist from Cottingham, East Yorkshire. He plays Electronic, Theatre and Classical organ at 2 local churches. His concert repertoire includes music from; theatre organ, orchestral, film music, show tunes, big-band jazz and popular tunes from across the years. The music is his own style and interpretation in which he takes great pride.

From the young age of eight. Lewis was learning at the keyboard of a

Technics E55, moving on he progressed with instruments such as the Technics G7, and Roland Atelier AT900c.

Lewis joined the American Theatre Organ Societies, London Chapter.

He at the 'Young Theatre Organist of the Year' Competition in 2014, and in 2015 was awarded the Dean Herrick Memorial Trophy for promoting the theatre organ. In September of 2016 Lewis won the competition held at the Astoria Centre, Barnsley. He was again awarded the Dean Herrick Award in 2017 for further promoting the organ to new audiences. Since his time playing the theatre organ, he has played in young organist concerts across the country, and in 2017 performed his first solo concert at Ryehope, Sunderland. Lewis is an avid photographer and plays cricket when he can. he is a collector of organs, and when we last saw him he had several Technics Models including a GA3, C800 and FN3, and a vintage Hammond A100.

Also Lewis when we last saw him he was busy restoring a Compton Theatre organ from the Tonic, Bangor. originally built in 1936.

Next Concert - Steve Hubble 24th Sept 2024

Steve born and from Birmingham showed an early interest in music his first instrument was a Bontempi chord organ from Woolworths bought for him at the age of 4, with it he entertained pupils and teachers in school assemblies.

Steve loved playing the piano, he worked through graded exams but all the time he was forming a passionate interest in the electronic organ. At the age of 16 Steve had his first electronic organ, 2 years later he entered and won the 1983 Midlands Organist of the Year Contest. This launched his professional career as a concert organist and keyboard player. He has extensively toured throughout the UK playing for Organ Societies, Keyboard Clubs and Festivals.

Last concert - Michael Wooldridge - 23rd July 2024

After Michael last performed for us 22nd November 2022 the Club was pleased to welcome him back for our 23rd July 2024 concert. Disappointingly fewer of our members attended than expected, perhaps reflecting the summer holiday season now with us. For the concert the instrument brought was his smaller Roland AT-15. Size didn't matter?? The AT-15 was loaded with sounds from his larger Atelier organ and with it he performed to great effect. An excellent well applauded concert with medleys of many genres including some captivating pipe organ sounds punctuated with moments of humour.
